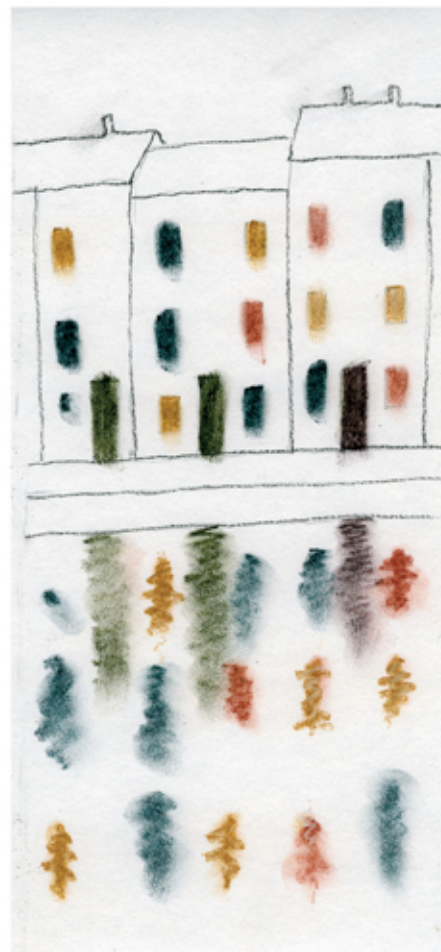
INTRODUCTION

Tinted Charcoal offers the dramatic beauty of traditional charcoal with a hint of colour. Natural charcoal particles and a small amount of colour pigment are combined with the finest clays then encased in wood to produce a wonderfully expressive tool. Available in 24 fabulous shades, including white for highlighting, the colours smudge and blend beautifully to produce deep, rich tones.

MATERIALS USED:

Derwent Tinted Charcoal pencils used: Dark, Sand TC01, Sunset Pink TC03, Heather Mist TC05, Lavender TC07, Thistle TC08, Mountain Blue TC11, Forest Pine TC14, Green Moss TC15, White TC21

Smooth surface white drawing paper
175 gms



1 Using the Dark Charcoal pencil lightly draw the buildings as shown.

Using Sand TC01, Sunset Pink TC03 and Mountain Blue TC11 block in the windows using the point of the pencil, and then diffuse the pigment using your finger by gently moving it up and down on the paper. If you want to lighten the colour overlay this with some White TC21 after diffusing the colour. There is no need to soften this afterwards.

Tackle the reflections at the same time using a zigzag drawing movement using the point of the pencil then diffuse as before. The wider the stroke the more movement is suggested in the water.

Shade the doors using Heather Mist TC05 and Green Moss TC15 in exactly the same way and add the reflections as before.
